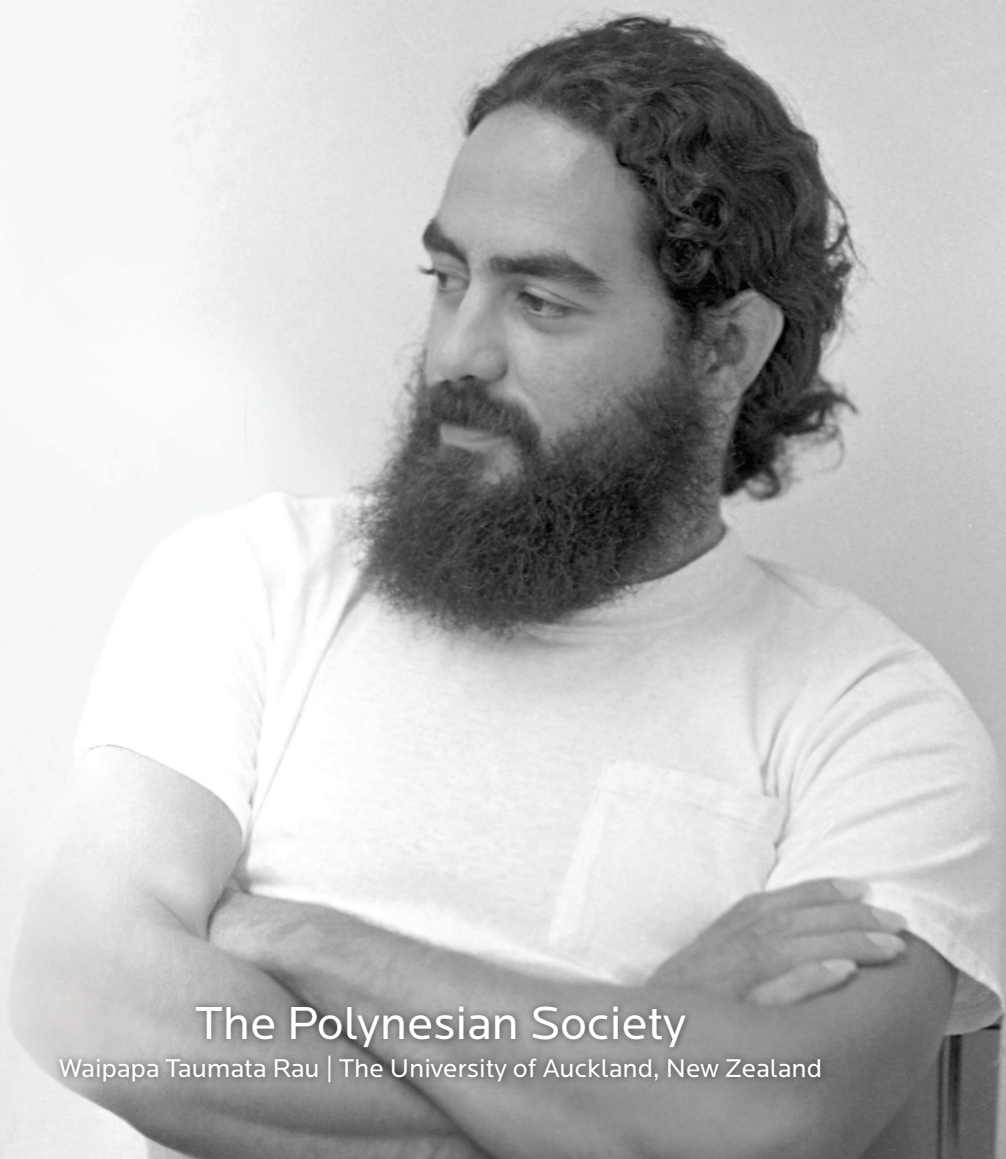

Since 1892, *The Journal of the Polynesian Society*, renamed *Waka Kuaka: The Journal of the Polynesian Society* in 2023, has been a major forum for the discussion of cultural and social aspects of the past and present lives and cultures of New Zealand Māori and all other peoples of Pacific/Oceanic heritage, including those of Polynesia, Micronesia and Melanesia. The Editors welcome submissions of manuscripts in the areas of archaeology, biological and medical anthropology, cultural/social anthropology, ethnomusicology, material culture studies and art history, ethnology, history, linguistics, political studies, Indigenous law and sociology. *Waka Kuaka* especially encourages manuscripts that cross-cut disciplinary boundaries and are likely to be of broad interest.

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
