THE SOCIETY was formed in 1892. Its aim is to promote the scholarly study of past and present New Zealand Māori and other Pacific Island peoples and cultures.

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Admission to membership of the Society is by application and is granted on the approval of the Council. Application forms are available on our website www.thepolynesiansociety.org or may be obtained from the Secretary (jps@auckland.ac.nz).

Every person accepted for membership receives notice of election from the Secretary, and on payment of the current year's subscription becomes entitled to all the benefits of membership, including all issues of the online journal. Thereafter, subscriptions are payable in advance, on 1 January each year either by electronic bank transfer or via the website.

Annual membership dues are NZ\$50.00. Institutional (non-Society members) subscriptions are NZ\$200.00 both within New Zealand and overseas. Student members are entitled to a 50 percent discount on subscriptions (maximum tenure three years).

Life membership, costing NZ\$100.00, is restricted to those who have been members of the Society for 10 years or more and have reached 60 years of age.

Since 1892, *The Journal of the Polynesian Society*, renamed *Waka Kuaka: The Journal of the Polynesian Society* in 2023, has been a major forum for the discussion of cultural and social aspects of the past and present lives and cultures of New Zealand Māori and all other peoples of Pacific/Oceanic heritage, including those of Polynesia, Micronesia and Melanesia. The Editors welcome submissions of manuscripts in the areas of archaeology, biological and medical anthropology, cultural/social anthropology, ethnomusicology, material culture studies and art history, ethnology, history, linguistics, political studies, Indigenous law and sociology. *Waka Kuaka* especially encourages manuscripts that cross-cut disciplinary boundaries and are likely to be of broad interest.

Manuscripts are peer-reviewed by academic readers before publication is considered. Before submitting a manuscript, authors should consult The Polynesian Society website for style and format guidelines.
